Highlights of a Comparative Study of the Educational System for Physical Education in Liberal Arts Higher Education (PEHE) Courses in Japan, Korea and Taiwan

- Existence of PEHE courses in Taiwan-99.3%, Japan-97.7% and Korea-90.0% at colleges and universities (hereafter, CUs).
- (2) Existence of PEHE courses as compulsory subjects in Taiwan-100% (100%), Japan-28.0% (40.8%) and Korea-6.4% (8.2%) * at CUs.
- * There are two results of compulsory subjects as follows: Main percentage data = Compulsory at all undergraduate departments; (In parenthesis) = Compulsory at some undergraduate departments.
- (3) There were a number of CUs offering courses mainly dealing with <u>practical PEHE courses</u> in **Taiwan**-100%, **Japan**-98.2%, and **Korea**-90.4% at CUs.
- (4) There were a number of CUs offering lectures of PEHE courses Korea-63.9%, Japan-63.4% and Taiwan-0% at CUs.
- The educational goals most emphasized in PEHE courses were "Understanding the importance of cooperative play and improvement in communication skills" in Japan, "Improvements in physical strength and physical activities" in Korea, and "Establishment of regular lifestyles" in Taiwan at CUs.
- 6 The viewpoint of grading evaluation most emphasized in PEHE courses were "Attitude/Motivation" in Japan, and "Motor skill" in Korea and Taiwan at CUs.
- The number of highest degree faculty members in charge of PEHE courses was the doctor's degree in Korea at CUs, compared to master's degree in Japan and Taiwan at CUs.
- The part-time lecturers were more than half of the number of faculty in charge of PEHE courses in Korea at CUs, while the full-time faculty members were more than half of the number of faculty in charge of PEHE courses in Japan and Taiwan at CUs.

Purpose

'Study investigated current status of PEHE courses for all CUs and educational system of PEHE courses in Japan, Korea & Taiwan with the aim to acquire information as basic materials contributing to PEHE courses in CUs, from comparing the current status in each country'

A complete survey of PEHE courses for all CUs "

→ 1) Existence of PEHE course, 2) Compulsory or optional, 3) Course type

- **Japan**: <u>742 CUs</u> (national-81, public-86, private-575)
- ◆ **Korea**: <u>190 CUs</u> (national-44, public-1, private-145) ❖ Web research → CUs regulations, handbook and syllabus.
- ◆ **Taiwan**: 143 CUs (national-48, public-1, private-94)
 - Research data of the Ministry of Education in Taiwan (2017)
 - \clubsuit Research period \rightarrow August 2016 March 2018.
 - * Excluding graduate universities and PE colleges in each country.

- → The educational system of PEHE (Curriculum, Faculty profile, Course status)
- ◆ Japan: <u>50 CUs</u> (national-13, public-5, private-32)
- **Korea**: 10 CUs (national-2, private-8)
- ◆ Taiwan: 10 CUs (national-5, private-5)
 - ❖ Questionnaire and Interview survey → Purposeful sampling
 - ightharpoonup Research period ightharpoonup May 2017 June 2018.
 - * In Korea and Taiwan, we observed PEHE classes and examined current status.

- Almost all CUs had offered mainly practical PEHE courses in Japan, Korea and **Taiwan**, and their compulsory rates was **Korea < Japan < Taiwan**.
- The educational goals most emphasized in PEHE courses were different in each country, but Korea and Taiwan had commonality from the viewpoint of grade evaluation.
- The number of highest degree faculty members with doctor's degree in charge of PEHE courses at CUs was in **Korea**, and the lowest rate of part-time lecturers in charge of PEHE courses was in **Japan**.
